# PERSONAL STUDY

**Read Mark 14:26-31 and Mark 14: 43-51**

## **OPENING REMARKS:**

During the Last Supper with His disciples, Jesus announces that one of the twelve disciples was going to betray Him. Jesus makes the announcement to assure His disciples that He is in control of all things, even the events that were now about to take place. Also, to alert the betrayer that he was known and that he has one last opportunity to reconsider and repent. After the Last Supper, they went to the Mount of Olives.

The Mount of Olives covered quite an extensive area. It provided many suitable camping spots for pilgrims attending the feast. Finding any one group there at night, even on a clear moonlit night, would not have been easy. Jesus and his disciples had their favourite spot that they had used before on other nights, the garden of Gethsemane.

It is here that the arrest of Jesus would take place.

**STUDY QUESTIONS:**

**Closing remarks:**

Long before the night took place, Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him. Jesus was normal enough in appearance that it was necessary for Judas to identify Him. He chose to identify Jesus by greeting Him with a kiss.

Cruelly, Judas addressed Jesus as "Rabbi," an act of respect, and then he kissed Him. Mark uses an emphasized form of that word, a word that means a

prolonged kiss, a lover's kiss. "Kissed" is the same word used of the father of the prodigal son kissing him when he comes home, or the Ephesian elders kissing the apostle Paul good-bye. Such a kiss should have indicated loyalty, affection, friendship, and trust, but Judas turned all of those characteristics upside down.

Jesus marvelled that they sent a small army to arrest Him. Yet, He was in command; with a word He could destroy all those who came to arrest Him. But Jesus went along in order to fulfill Scripture.

At this point, all the disciples scattered and ran for their own safety. A few (Peter and John at least) followed back to see what would happen at a distance. None of them stood beside Jesus and said, "I have given my life to this Man. What you accuse Him of, you may accuse me of also." Instead, it was fulfilled what Jesus said: *All of you will be made to stumble because of Me* (Mark 14:27).

To endure the persecution of enemies is one thing, the abandonment by friends is another. The former we expect, but the latter always catches us off guard. Jesus was not only betrayed by one of His own disciples, but also abandoned by the others and denied by one of his closest friends.
